Program	For the Apprentice	Amount \$
<b>Support to Non-EI Eligible Apprentices</b>	This initiative provides up to \$1,500 of taxable financial supports for apprentices who attend full-time in-school apprenticeship training and are not eligible for Employment Insurance (EI) <a href="http://www.ontario.ca/page/start-apprenticeship">www.ontario.ca/page/start-apprenticeship</a>	Up to \$1,500
<b>The Loans for Tools Program</b>	Offers new apprentices a loan to help them buy the tools and equipment they need to perform the trade in which they are registered. The loan is interest-free for the duration of the apprentice's training and for up to one year following the completion of training. <a href="http://www.ontario.ca/page/start-apprenticeship#section-8">www.ontario.ca/page/start-apprenticeship#section-8</a>	The maximum loan an apprentice may receive varies according to sector: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• service \$300</li> <li>• construction \$400</li> <li>• manufacturing \$400</li> <li>• automotive service \$800</li> </ul>
<b>The Tradesperson's Tools Deduction</b>	Provides employed apprentices with a tax deduction to help cover the cost of new tools necessary for their trade. <a href="http://www.cra-arc.gc.ca/trades/">www.cra-arc.gc.ca/trades/</a>	Up to \$500 tax deduction on new tools.
<b>The Apprenticeship Incentive Grant</b>	A taxable cash grant available to registered apprentices once they have successfully finished their first or second year/level (or equivalent) of an apprenticeship program in one of the Red Seal trades. <a href="http://www.servicecanada.gc.ca/eng/goc/apprenticeship/incentivegrant/program.shtml">www.servicecanada.gc.ca/eng/goc/apprenticeship/incentivegrant/program.shtml</a>	\$1,000 per year, up to a maximum of \$2,000 per person.
<b>The Apprenticeship Completion Grant</b>	A one-time taxable cash grant available to registered apprentices who have successfully completed their apprenticeship training and obtained their journey person certification in a designated Seal trade. <a href="http://www.servicecanada.gc.ca/eng/goc/apprenticeship/completiongrant/program.shtml">www.servicecanada.gc.ca/eng/goc/apprenticeship/completiongrant/program.shtml</a>	Up to \$2,000 maximum.
<b>The Apprenticeship Completion Bonus in Non-Red Seal Trades</b>	The grant is available to registered apprentices after they successfully complete their apprenticeship training and obtain their Certificate of Apprenticeship and, where available, their Certificate of Qualification in any Ontario non-Red Seal trade. <a href="http://www.tcu.gov.on.ca/eng/employmentontario/employers/apprenticeship_bonus.html">www.tcu.gov.on.ca/eng/employmentontario/employers/apprenticeship_bonus.html</a>	A taxable cash grant of \$2,000.
<b>The Apprenticeship Scholarship</b>	The Apprenticeship Scholarship provides support individuals who require upgrading to meet the academic eligibility requirements for their chosen trade. <a href="http://www.tcu.gov.on.ca/eng/apprentices/app_schol.html">www.tcu.gov.on.ca/eng/apprentices/app_schol.html</a>	Up to \$1,000.
<b>OYAP: Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program</b>	Ontario Youth can be signed as an apprentice while still in high school (as early as Grade 11). MTCU pays the \$40.00 registration fee. <a href="http://www.oyap.com">www.oyap.com</a>	Free Registration
<b>Canada Apprentice Loan</b>	An interest-free loan per period of technical training. You can use the money to help pay for tuition, tools, equipment and living expenses, to cover forgone wages or to help support your family. <a href="http://www.canada.ca/en/employment-social-development/services/apprentices/loan.html">www.canada.ca/en/employment-social-development/services/apprentices/loan.html</a>	Up to \$4,000
<b>Employment Ontario Employment Services</b>	Employment Ontario can help you get training, build skills or find a job. 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## Employer Incentives

Program	For the Employer/Sponsor	Amount \$
<b>The Apprenticeship Training Tax Credit</b>	A refundable tax credit available to employers who hire and train apprentices in certain skilled trades during the first 36 months of an apprenticeship program. To download an application form and to see if you are eligible please go to: <a href="http://www.fin.gov.on.ca/en/credit/attc/">http://www.fin.gov.on.ca/en/credit/attc/</a>	The maximum credit for each apprenticeship is \$5,000 per year. The maximum credit over the first 36 month period of the apprenticeship is \$15,000.
<b>The Apprenticeship Job Creation Tax Credit</b>	A non-refundable tax credit equal to 10% of the eligible salaries and wages paid to eligible apprentices. To download an application form and to see if you are eligible please go to: <a href="http://bit.ly/IDIXke">http://bit.ly/IDIXke</a>	Up to \$2,000 per year for each eligible apprentice.
<b>Apprenticeship Employer Signing Bonus</b>	The Apprenticeship Employer Signing Bonus (AESB) is available to employers who hire, register, and train an apprentice as part of their participation in the Employment Service program. For more information, please visit: <a href="http://www.tcu.gov.on.ca/eng/employers/emp_bonus.html">http://www.tcu.gov.on.ca/eng/employers/emp_bonus.html</a>	\$2,000 total-\$1,000 for signing an apprentice, then \$1,000 to employers or sponsors whose apprentice is still working and training with at least six months
<b>Apprenticeship Completion Employer Bonus</b>	A taxable cash grant for each apprentice they hire, train and that completes his or her apprenticeship training - receiving a Certificate of Apprenticeship and where, applicable, a Certificate of Qualification. <a href="http://www.tcu.gov.on.ca/eng/employmentontario/training/appr_completion_fin.html">http://www.tcu.gov.on.ca/eng/employmentontario/training/appr_completion_fin.html</a>	\$1000 for each apprentice that completes their apprenticeship.
<b>Co-operative Education Tax Credit</b>	The Co-operative Education Tax Credit is a refundable tax credit. It is available to employers who hire students enrolled in a co-operative education program at an Ontario university or college. <a href="http://www.fin.gov.on.ca/en/credit/cetc/">http://www.fin.gov.on.ca/en/credit/cetc/</a>	The maximum credit for each work placement is \$3,000
<b>OYAP: Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program</b>	Ontario Youth can be signed as an apprentice while still in high school (as early as Grade 11). OYAP students are exempt from ratio requirements when on placement. <a href="http://www.oyap.com">http://www.oyap.com</a>	Free Registration
